Life in Alaska's wild west is unique - hardly any region on earth is as remote as this one.

At the edge of the date line, the inhabitants of these lonely islands look to the other side of the Bering Sea, which is always a day ahead. How do people live in remote regions that can only be reached by plane or helicopter? We visit the former gold mining town Nome. Long after the gold rush has passed, they now search for other treasures of the polar sea: the king crabs. But you still find people infected by the gold rush and looking for the next big find during live-threatening dives. With impressive shots and unique stories, this documentary paints an authentic picture of life on the islands on the edge of time.
